PEABODIAN OF THE QUARTER

Rev. Dr. Herbert Winston Anderson is a native of Petersburg, VA, the youngest of six children born to the late George A. and Mary B. Anderson. He grew up in the Birdville community, was baptized at age eleven, and joined Gillfield Baptist Church in Petersburg. He attended the Petersburg City Public Schools and graduated from Peabody High School in 1948. He received a Bachelor's degree in Religious Education and an Honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Virginia Seminary and College of Lynchburg, now Virginia University of Lynchburg.

Rev. Dr. Anderson was licensed to preach on May 3, 1981 and ordained November 25, 1983 by Rocky Branch Baptist Church. He is a member of Rocky

Branch Baptist Church in Sutherland. Rev. Dr. Anderson retired as Pastor of the Sharon Baptist Church in Dinwiddie County with 31 years of service and was bestowed the honor of Pastor Emeritus. He also served as Pastor of Center Star Baptist Church in Dinwiddie for 12 years and served 4 years in the U.S. Army, experiencing combat in the Korean War. Rev. Dr. Anderson retired from Allied Signal Fiber's Division, Chesterfield, VA after 27 years of service.

Rev. Dr. Anderson has served the community in many civic and professional organizations. He served as Director of the Dinwiddie County Food Bank; President of the Dinwiddie County Clergy Association (comprised of interracial and interdenominational ministers); Past Chairman of the Trustee Board of The Children's Home of Virginia Baptist, Inc.; Past President of the Baptist Ministers Conference of Petersburg; Past Moderator of the Ebenezer Baptist Association and It's Allied Bodies; and Past President of the United Churches of Dinwiddie. In addition, Rev. Dr. Anderson was selected to eulogize the two Black Law Enforcement Officers who were slain in Dinwiddie (Lt. James Weaver and Trooper Junious Walker), which was televised statewide. He was one of the four persons recognized by the Dinwiddie County Board of Supervisors as "Hometown Heroes" for the First Black History Recognition Program ever held in the County. He holds memberships in the NAACP, the SCLC, the Peabody High School National Alumni Association, Inc., and the Lynchburg Alumni Association.

Rev. Dr. Anderson has been married for 62 years to the former Obena Wyatt of Sutherland, VA and they are the proud parents of three daughters (one deceased)—all college graduates; one foster daughter, six grandchildren (college graduates) and six great-grandchildren (all in school and active in the church) and they reside in Sutherland, Virginia.





PEABODIANS IN THE MINISTRY

Rev. Dr. Rebecca Branch-Griffin is a 1970 graduate of Peabody. She completed her Bachelors degree in Nursing and her Masters and Doctorate in Healthcare Administration. She has done further study at Samuel D. Proctor School of Theology at Virginia Union University. Dr. Branch-Griffin has pastored three AME Zion Churches in Virginia before being assigned in 2005 to the historical Oak Street AME Zion Church, Petersburg, VA. She is the first female to assume that role in the church's 173 year history.

On March 1, 2015, Dr. Branch-Griffin retired as Director of Health and Counseling Services at Virginia State University. She has received numerous awards and commendations for her work in the ministry and in community health. Her services continue as a member of Petersburg Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority; Petersburg Chapter of Links Incorporated; President of the FLITE Foundation, which undergirds the Petersburg Freedom Support Center for Veterans; Board Director for the Petersburg YMCA; and Petersburg Area Art League. She is leading Oak Street in renovating



the old school board warehouse, adjacent to the church, into 58 units of affordable efficiency housing units for veterans. Dr. Branch-Griffin is the mother of three adult children and their spouses, along with four adorable grandchildren.



Rev. William E. Clarke is a 1956 graduate of Peabody. He is a native of Petersburg and the son of the late James and Ethel Clarke. He was baptized at Oak Street AME Zion Church and now hold membership at the Brown Grove Baptist Church in Chesterfield, Virginia, which is pastored by Rev. Andrew Carey of Petersburg.

Rev. Clarke holds a B.S. degree in Education and a Masters of Education in Administration and Supervision from Virginia Commonwealth University. He studied for one year at Virginia Union University in the School of Theology. He served in the United States Army from 1959-1962 in the 82nd Airborne Division as a paratrooper. He is a Past President of the Chesterfield Deacon and Deaconess Union and a former teacher of its training class. He retired from the Richmond Public School System as a fifth grade teacher in 1998.

Rev. Clarke was licensed to preach the gospel on February 22, 1984 and was ordained on August 11, 1985. For the past 20 years, he has been the Pastor of Pleasant Hill Baptist Church in Lawrenceville, Virginia. Recently, the Church Scholarship Fund was named in his honor.


He is married to the former Zeldna Turner and they have one son, Rodney, and a daughter-in-law, Tanya.

Rev. Brenda L. Wilson Cherry is a 1967 graduate of Peabody. Rev. Cherry is a life-long resident of Petersburg and a 1985 graduate of the Petersburg Practical Nursing Program. She is the daughter of Mrs. Anna M. Wilson and the late Ralph Wilson. She has been married for 47 years to her high school sweetheart, the Rev. Leroy A. Cherry. Rev. Cherry is First Lady and serves as Associate Minister of Third Baptist Church, Petersburg. She was licensed to preach on March 10, 2014 and ordained on November 23, 2014. She is a member of the Unified Shiloh Baptist Association of Southside, Virginia and Past President of the Women's Department. She currently serves as Chairperson of the Time & Place Committee. Rev. Cherry is also a member of the Spiritual Care Services at Southside Regional Medical Center and serves as Volunteer Chaplain. She is a past member of the J.E.B. Stuart School PTA and a past member of the ICPC Auxiliary (International Conference of Police Chaplains Auxiliary for spouses).

Rev. Cherry loves the Lord and feels that "Happiness in serving the Lord is sharing it with family and friends." She is thankful to God for being where she is in such a time as this. At Third Baptist, she serves as one of the teachers of the Adult Sunday School Class; a Vacation Bible School teacher; President/Directress of the Mass Choir; and member of the Christian Education Board. Her favorite scriptures are in the Book of Psalms.



Rev. Leroy A. Cherry is a 1967 (summer) graduate of Peabody. He is the son of the late Inez McCoy and Percy Davis. He is married to Rev. Brenda Wilson Cherry and they are proud parents, grandparents and great-grandparents. Rev. Cherry served six years in the Virginia Army National Marine Corps and seven years in the Virginia Army National Guard with the rank of Sergeant. He is a graduate of Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology at Virginia Union University. He has attended Lynchburg Seminary & College, Virginia Polytechnic School, Virginia State University and John Tyler Community College. He is a student in Okinawan Kenpo and has earned a 1st Degree Black Belt. Rev. Cherry heard the Word of God calling him into the ministry and preached his initial sermon on Sunday, January 16, 1983 at the First Baptist Church, Harrison Street, Petersburg, VA, under the leadership of Rev. Clyde Johnson, and was ordained in 1986. He is the former pastor of First Baptist Church McKenney, where he


served for ten years, and Good Hope Baptist Church, Blackridge, VA where he served for nine years. Upon accepting the call to pastor Third Baptist Church, Rev. Cherry bid farewell to those churches in August, 1996. He became the Pastor of Third Baptist Church on September 1, 1996. Rev. Cherry's favorite motto is "To God Be The Glory." He truly believes that if he can show somebody the way to salvation in Jesus Christ and His righteousness, that his living has not been in vain.

Reverend Bland obtained a B.S. degree in Business Administration from Virginia State University in 1973, an Associate Degree in Applied Sciences from the School of Mortuary Science in 1974, and a Master of Divinity from the School of Theology at Virginia Union University in 1982. He is the former Pastor of First Baptist Church, Waverly, where he and his family served faithfully for 12 years (1984-1996), and Pastor Emeritus of Metropolitan Baptist Church, Petersburg. He received his "Doctor of Ministry" accreditation from the Living Water Bible Institute on June 21, 2008. Rev. Rev. Dr. Ora Peterson is a 1970 graduate of Peabody. She is a native of Petersburg and the daughter of the late Deacon Eddie and Eliza A. Peterson. Upon graduation from Peabody, she entered Virginia State College (now University) where she received a B.S. degree (cum laude) and a Master of Education in elementary education. Additionally, she taught Christian Education classes and conducted educational workshops for the Baptist General Convention of Virginia and served as a member of the Christian Education Planning Team. In May 1987, Rev. Dr. Peterson preached her initial sermon at the Gillfield Baptist Church, Petersburg, under the pastorate of the Rev. Dr. Grady W. Powell, Sr. She served as

the Youth Ministry Coordinator and Director of Christian Education. In 1990, she was ordained and later became Assistant to the Pastor. Rev. Dr. Peterson has been a contributing member of many professional and community organizations. Her past and present affiliations are: Co-director of the Leviticus Chapter of Christians United for Christ Ministries; Co-hostess for "A Glimpse into the Church" (TV Channel 4); Board Directors of the National Coalition of 100 Black Women, NAACP, SCLC, Petersburg Chapter #33 of the Order of Eastern Star, the Petersburg Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Pi Lambda Theta Sorority, the Women's Association, the Richmond, the Virginia and the National Education Association, and the Southside Council of Reading Educators.



Rev. Dr. Margie Stith Chrichlow Smith is a 1966 graduate of Peabody and was elected Chaplain of her senior class. She is a resident of Newport News, VA. She received her B.S. degree in Accounting in 1971 from Virginia Union University and for a number of years worked at Blue Cross Blue Shield of Richmond, serving in management during her last years. In 1995, she received her Master of Divinity degree from Virginia Union University School of Theology and in 1996 completed requirements for the Masters of Guidance Counseling at Virginia State University. She is a licensed professional counselor and a certified substance abuse counselor for the State of Virginia.

Rev. Dr. Smith's calling to the ministry was that of a Pastoral Counselor. She served at First Baptist Church, S. Richmond, as a Pastoral Counselor for 10+

years. During that time, she received her Doctor of Ministry degree from Virginia Union University School of Theology in 2002. She is also on the adjunct faculty of Virginia Union University School of Theology. In 2007, Rev. Dr. Smith joined Good Shepherd Baptist Church in Petersburg, under the leadership of Pastor Jeffrey Reaves, Sr. She serves as the pastoral counselor and as one of the Stephen Leaders of the Stephen Ministry, which is a pastoral care ministry for laypersons.

In 2008, Rev. Dr. Smith opened her pastoral counseling/mental health counseling business in Richmond. She is the proud mother of a son and a set of twin daughters, and the proud grandmother of a grandson and a set of twins.

Elder James L. Clarke, Sr. is a 1964 graduate of Peabody. He is the Senior Pastor and Founder of Power of Praise Bible Way Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ located in Hopewell. In 1986, Pastor Clarke received a word from the Lord "The time is now, GO FORTH." Pastor Clarke's vision for Power of Praise is to "Make followers into leaders, to fulfill their potential."

Pastor Clarke was saved at the age of 24 and received his foundational training at Calvary Temple (then Mt.
