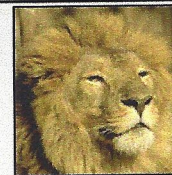

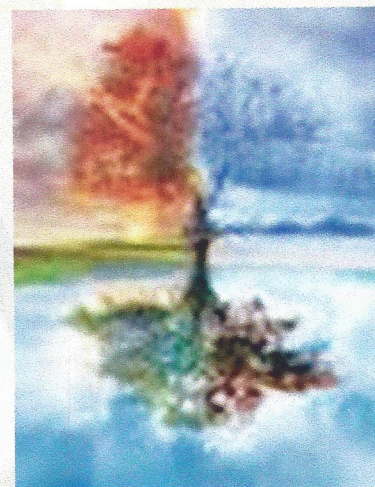
The Seasons In Life

Delegate Rosalyn R. Dance

Delegate Rosalyn R. Dance, a resident of Petersburg, Virginia, graduated from Peabody High School in 1966. She received her Associate Degree in Nursing, with honors, from John Tyler Community College in 1981. In 1986, she received her Bachelor's degree in Nursing from Virginia State University and her Master's degree in Public Administration from Virginia Commonwealth University in 1994.

While commencing a career in public service, Delegate Dance worked at the Southside Virginia Training Center (SVTC) for 34 years. During the early years of her employment with SVTC, she worked as a Psychiatric Nurse's Aide. She subsequently rose to the position of Interim Facility Director and retired holding the position of Assistant Director of Residential Services.

In 1992, Delegate Dance was elected as Mayor of the City of Petersburg—retaining that office for 12 years. During her tenure as Mayor, she initiated the citywide “Petersburg: A City of Readers Program” and helped reduce Petersburg's incarcerated youth population. In addition, she played an instrumental role in securing Virginia's first Governor's School for Arts and Technology, the Appomattox Regional Governor's School, which opened in Petersburg in September, 1999.



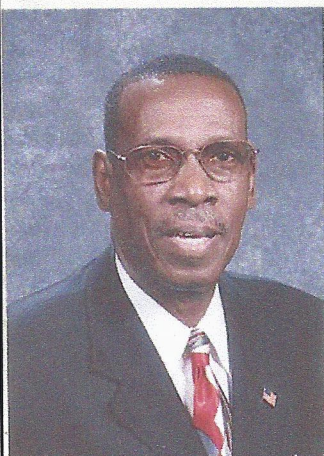
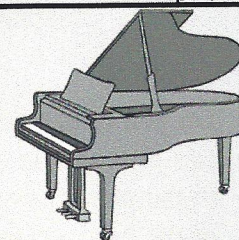
In April 2005, Delegate Dance was elected to the Virginia General Assembly. Immediately upon taking office, she helped Governor Mark Warner obtain millions of dollars in additional funding for education and public safety. She also secured a \$500,000 state grant to begin dredging the Petersburg harbor and to help spur tourism and economic development along the waterfront. During the 2006 and 2007 sessions of the Virginia General Assembly, Delegate Dance filed numerous bills and budget amendments to improve the city of Petersburg, the County of Dinwiddie and the Ettrick and Matoaca areas of Chesterfield. She currently sits on three distinguished committees within the House of Delegate (Appropriations, General Laws, and Privileges and Elections) and serves as Vice Chair of Operations and Policy for the House Democratic Caucus.

In addition to fulfilling her responsibilities as a member of the Virginia General Assembly, Delegate Dance currently serves on numerous government-related boards, as well as multiple civic and/or professional organizations. Furthermore, she is chair of the Petersburg Democratic Committee and the vice chair of the Fourth Congressional District Democratic Committee. She is a member of the Petersburg Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., The Petersburg Chapter of Links, Inc., past president and member of the Petersburg Breakfast Rotary Club. Most importantly, she and her husband, Nathaniel (Nat) Dance, Sr. (class of '55) are members of the historic Gillfield Baptist Church, Petersburg, Va. They have two children, four grandchildren, one great-grandchild, and one foster grandchild.

Rev. Vernon "Billy" Lee



The Reverend Vernon S. Lee is a native of Petersburg, Virginia. He is a graduate of the Peabody High class of 1956 and currently serves as class President.

In 1978, Rev. Lee became the pastor of New Mount Vernon Baptist Church in Portsmouth, Va. Under his leadership, the congregation grew spiritually and financially. In 1989, Rev. Lee guided the members to do their best in giving and in serving. As a result, they were able to erect a new edifice with a 750-seat sanctuary and an administrative/educational wing.

During his pastorate, his musical talent also enriched the church's ministry. He reorganized the Department of Music and was instrumental in presenting the Young Adult Choir, currently known as The Lee Crusaders, at the 1980 James Cleveland Music Workshop. In addition, he founded the Mass Missionary Choir, which is rated one of the best traditional choirs in the Hampton Roads area.

In Petersburg, Rev. Lee (known as "Billy" Lee), organized a group of high school students who have come to be known as "Experience," a highly versatile group of individuals who sing and travel throughout the United States. Rev. Lee was the producer and host of "Spread A Little Sunshine," which was aired on WAVY-TV at 10:00 a.m. every Sunday morning and he is the former producer of "The Gospel Truth," a program that was televised for over twenty-eight years in the Central Virginia area.

Further, to his professional credit, he has performed with both the National Symphony Orchestra in Washington, D.C. and the Virginia Symphony Orchestra in Norfolk. He has made seven albums and six 45's; served as pianist for the Angelic Gospel Singers of Philadelphia, Pa.; organist for Mahalia Jackson; and performed in over fifteen U.S. cities.

His music career has been expansive and varied, having studied under such outstanding teachers as Dr. Undine Moore, William McKinley, Bessie King, Bernard Jones, Dr. Aldrich Adkins, Gwendolyn B. Jones, and others.

Rev. Lee is currently Pastor Emeritus of Miracle of Faith Baptist Church Independent in Portsmouth, Va. After his retirement, he became a volunteer for the Petersburg School System, serving Peabody Junior High (now Peabody Middle School) for 4 years and Petersburg High School for 10 years. He is also currently serving as Minister of Music at Greater Faith AME Zion Church in Petersburg. He directs the Celestial Voices of the Petersburg District of the AME Zion Churches.

As an inspired servant of God with many talents, Rev. Lee is also a family man. He is married to Cecilia Scott Lee (class of '60) and they are the parents of four adult children. They also have seven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

If you attended the unveiling of the Peabody High School Historical Highway Marker on May 26, 2012, you should remember hearing the melodious voice of Rev. Lee as he sang a beautiful rendition of "My Tribute."

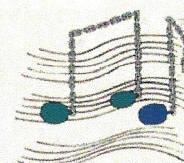

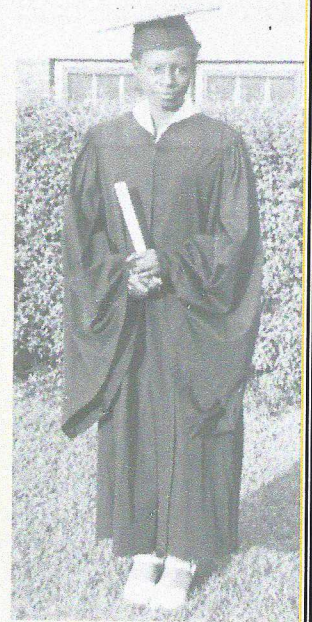
Mrs. Moorer is a resident of Colonial Heights, Va. She is a graduate of Peabody High School Class of 1945 and a recent member of the Peabody High School National Alumni Association, Inc. She attended John Tyler Community College and Virginia State College (now University). She has been an active member of the historic Gillfield Baptist Church for over 70 years, presently serving as Vice President of the Sanctuary Choir, Chaplain of the Women's Fellowship, President of the Parish Club, member of the Gospel Choir, and past President of the Ushers Ministry.

Mrs. Moorer retired from the Petersburg Public School System in 1991 and has been working as a part-time teacher in the Adult Continuing Education Program since 1992. She has been, and still is active, in many community affiliations since 1960. The following are just a few of the many affiliations and awards she has received:

✓ "The Greensboro Four," who wanted much more than the coffee and donuts the waitress refused to serve them at a "white's only" lunch counter in Greensboro, North Carolina;

✓ The Tuskegee Airmen, who risked sacrificing their lives but was separated from other soldiers because of the color of their skin;

✓ 1909, when the NAACP was founded; whose goals were to ensure the political, educational, social economic equality of minority citizens;

✓ The "Civil Rights Movement" during the 1950's, when the Black leaders began to use marches, demonstrations, and the courts to defeat racist laws.

✓ 1968 when Martin Luther King, Jr. is killed;

✓ 1983, when Jesse Jackson runs for President;



✓ The 1995 Million Man March," that spoke about the unfairness still faced by Black men in this country;

✓ November 4, 2008, when the nation and American voters went to the polls and gave Barack Obama a resounding victory... **The first African-American President of the United States.**
