Peabodian of the Quarter

Dr. Paulette Walker Johnson is one of our community's most highly regarded citizens. A native of Dinwiddie County, Virginia, and a longtime resident of Petersburg, she is the eldest of two children born to Deacon Robert Melvin Walker and Elsie Cooke Walker of Petersburg, Virginia. She has one brother, Wayne Melvin Walker and his wife Gaye Whiting Walker and two nephews, Terry and Travis Walker, who live in Accokeek, Maryland. She is also the proud mother of one son, Patrick Wayne Johnson who is an honor graduate of VSU (Class of 2004) and currently resides in Maryland. At the age of eight, she was baptized and joined the Little Zion Baptist Church in Carson, Virginia. Currently, she is a member of Zion Baptist Church in Petersburg. She completed her primary and secondary education in the public school system of Petersburg, graduating with honors from Peabody High School as "Miss Peabody" in 1969. According to Dr. Johnson, she got her initial cheering experience from the Mighty, Mighty Lions Cheering Squad at PHS.

Dr. Johnson received her Bachelor of Science Degree in Health and Physical Education from Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland and her Masters Degree from Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts. She later enrolled at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University in Blacksburg, Virginia and received her Doctorate Degree in Education. Since her appointment as a member of the Health and Physical Education Department in 1974, she has received many other accolades as well. In the academic arena, for example, she is an acclaimed scholar, much sought after guest lecturer, and viable member of several professional organizations. A tenured associate professor in the HPER Department at VSU, she has continued to labor arduously to ensure that her students receive cutting edge instruction and quality advisement. She has continuously received outstanding student evaluations and other similar tributes from her peers and administrators. Dr. Johnson was recognized for her outstanding achievement in teaching, research and public service as a 2002 recipient of the Distinguished Faculty Achievement Certificate awarded by the State Council of Higher Education.



Dr. Johnson serves on several committees and boards throughout the university and the Tri-cities. She is a former member of the Petersburg Public School Board and the Board of Directors for the Southside Area YMCA. Despite these extraordinary accomplishments, Dr. Johnson may be best known for her leadership of the nationally acclaimed "VSU Woo Woos Cheerleading Team." Her superior mentorship of this classy program has been applauded by local, regional and national admirers during her 30+ year coaching career.

The Woo Woos and Dr. Johnson have been featured on the BET television network, Urban Sports Network, ESPN and have had numerous

appearances on local based television stations. Several years ago, they performed at a boxing match staged by the legendary promoter Don King. Mr. King was so impressed with the way they mesmerized the audience that he was moved to make a financial contribution on their behalf to the VSU Athletic Department.

In addition to the aforesaid, in 1999 the Mayor of the City of Petersburg established "Dr. Paulette Walker Johnson Day" at halftime of VSU's 1999 Homecoming game. On this occasion, Dr. Johnson received a standing ovation from what has been discussed as the largest homecoming crowd in the school's history (est. 12,000). Further, she was the first female athletic director in VSU history. As if this were not enough, she also coached her Lady Trojan softball team to win the first CIAA Softball Championship in the mid-1970's. Dr. Johnson is a founding member of the CIAA Cheerleader Coaches Association. She is a 2003 inductee of the VSU Wall of Fame.

On Saturday, August 21, 2010, Dr. Johnson celebrated "35 Years of Perfection" at a Woo Woos Coach Retirement Banquet held at the Hilton Garden Inn. Additionally, the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA) inducted Dr. Paulette Walker Johnson (and six others) into the John B. McLendon, Jr. Hall of Fame on Friday, March 4, 2011. This induction ceremony was held at the Charlotte Convention Center at 11:00 a.m. as part of the CIAA Tournament's week of events.

When asked to what or whom does she attribute her success, she explains that she has always had the encouragement and unwavering support of a loving family. Dr. Johnson also quickly acknowledges that God is the center of her life and whatever she has accomplished is because of Him.

The Honorable George K. McKinney

Peabodian of the Quarter

Retired United States Marshal McKinney was born in Providence, RI and attended public schools in Boston, Massachusetts, Richmond and Petersburg, Va. He is a 1952 graduate of Peabody High School. He graduated from Morgan State College (now University) in 1956 as a distinguished military student with a B.S. Degree in Psychology. Marshal McKinney was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant and served in the U.S. Army during the period 1956-1965. While in the service, he served with the 82nd Airborne Division as a Master Paratrooper, Jumpmaster, Jungle Expert and was assigned to duties in Korea, Panama, Canal Zone and Ft. Bragg, NC. He was honorably discharged as a Captain in 1965.

Professionally, since leaving military service, Marshal McKinney has established an enviable record of public service and achievement with the federal government. The federal government established the United States Marshal Service in 1789. In 1973, Marshal McKinney was appointed as the 3rd African-American United States Marshal for the District of Columbia by the late President Richard M. Nixon. In 1995, he was appointed as the 1st African-American United States Marshal for the District of Maryland by President William J. Clinton. Marshal McKinney is one of the few Marshals who have been appointed in different federal districts by Presidents from two different political parties.

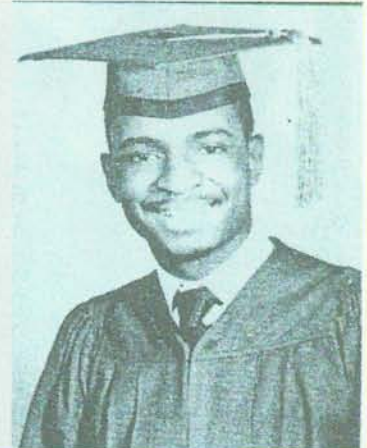
As the United States Marshal for the District of Columbia, he became the only United States Marshal who personally served a subpoena on a President of the United States while in office. He served a subpoena on President Nixon for the "Watergate Tapes." He also served as a Deputy U.S. Marshal during the period 1966-1968 and was a member of numerous Special Details throughout the country during the Civil Rights era. Marshal McKinney was one of the first African American Special Agents and Polygraph Examiner at the nation's super secret National Security Agency, Ft. Meade, MD during the period 1968-1973. In this capacity, he conducted over 1000 cases involving the national security. During the period 1977-1994, Marshal McKinney held numerous high level executive management positions with the U.S. Department of Justice in Washington, DC to include Director, Justice Protective Service; Assistant Director for Physical Security; Senior Security Specialist; Operations Security Officer and Computer Security Officer. He also served as a member of many high level interagency security and intelligence boards representing the Attorney General and the department.

Immediately after the September 11, 2001 attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City, the U.S. Marshals Office for the District of Maryland was directed by the Attorney General of the United States to assume and manage all security operations at the Baltimore Washington International-Marshall Airport. Under the direction of Marshal McKinney, his office performed their mission for some 60 days until relieved by the Maryland National Guard and the newly formed Transportation Security Administration.

Marshal McKinney retired from federal service in March 2002 after more than 45 years of dedicated service. He is the recipient of numerous awards and commendations from federal, state, local governments and the judiciary. In 1994, he testified before the U.S. House of Representative, Subcommittee on Crime, on behalf of the United States Marshals Service. In 2000, he was awarded the U.S. Marshals Service Director's Award for having the top U.S. Marshals District of the 94 federal districts. Additional honors include: Distinguished NAFEO recipient and induction in the Morgan State University (MSU) ROTC and Psychology Hall of Fame.

Marshal McKinney is active in the community and is a frequent requested speaker at community, church, fraternal and charitable organizations. He is a member of numerous professional and civic organizations to include: the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE); International Organization of Chiefs of Police (IACP); Omega Psi Phi Fraternity (life member); Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity; and the Howard L. Cornish Baltimore Chapter of the MSU National Alumni Association. He is the former President of the Men's League of Union Baptist Church, Baltimore, MD and currently serves as the Chairman of the Board of Deacons. He is the former Chairman of the Omega Life Membership Foundation, a national fraternal 501c-3 organization, and a three-term Basileus for Pi Omega Chapter.

In 1987, he was voted the Omega Man of the Year for Pi Omega Chapter and the Second District, and in 1988 he was the National Omega Man of the Year from the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. He served as a member of the Supreme Council and is the 22nd Second District Representative and Inspector General for the fraternity.

Marshal McKinney serves as a consultant on personnel and physical security matters with various private and public organizations, and is the CEO for Clamar, Inc., a property management organization. An avid genealogist, Marshal McKinney serves as the family genealogist for the McKinney-Ellis clan and is attempting to validate the family African origins. Marshal McKinney is a contributor to various charities to include the Morgan State University Foundation and Choir where he established scholarships in the name of his late father, Dr. Richard I. McKinney, Ph.D. (1928 Psi) and his late wife, Dr. Mildred S. McKinney, Ph.D. Both were long time faculty members of the university.

Marshal McKinney is the father of four adult college-educated children and has four grandchildren.

THE LIFE OF ROBERT H. COOLEY, JR.

Petersburg, Virginia civil rights Attorney Robert H. Cooley, Jr. passed away on February 19, 2011—nine days shy of his 102nd birthday (which would have been on February 28th). He was preceded by his wife, Ruth (Ruthie) Golden Cooley, his son and law partner, Robert III and daughter-in-law, Ruby.

Mr. Cooley graduated from Peabody High School in the February Class of 1927. After much encouragement from his mother and aunt, Mr. Cooley was the first in his family to attend college and graduated from Virginia Union University, where he was the student government president and an outstanding student. Again, urged, supported, and uplifted by his mother and aunt, Mr. Cooley attended Howard University's School of Law. There he was motivated by one of his upperclassmen, Thurgood Marshall, and the great Howard Law Dean, Charles Hamilton Houston.

When Mr. Cooley returned to Petersburg with his wife, they became strong advocates of political representation. Committed to the cause, Mr. Cooley never left the area. He was the campaign manager for the first Black elected to City Council in Petersburg, the late Mr. Joseph Owens. He also served as the campaign manager for the late Mr. Hermanze Fauntleroy, Jr., the second black elected to Petersburg's City Council and the first African-American Mayor of Petersburg. Mr. Cooley was the city campaign manager for Mrs. Rosalyn Dance, who was not only the Mayor of Petersburg, but also the first woman in the House of Delegates from the Petersburg area.

In February 2009, both the Senate of the Commonwealth of Virginia and the General Assembly passed two joint resolutions, commending Mr. Cooley for his "lifetime of distinguished legal, civil and social achievements to ensure equality." These resolutions were presented to him at his 100th birthday celebration. He also appeared on CBS, Channel 6 Richmond news program, during February '09. Mr. Cooley was a member of Oak Street AME Zion Church on Halifax (now Wythe) Street, where he served on the Board of Trustees.

He is survived by his son, Colonel (Ret.) Howard G. Cooley and his wife Bettye, four grandchildren, six great-grandchildren, a brother-in-law, a sister-in-law and two nieces.

On March 22, 2011, the Petersburg City Council presented to Mr. Cooley's family a plaque and resolution commemorating the life of Robert H. Cooley, Jr.
