he highlight of the October 6th meeting was the installation of the newly elected officers. Votes had been tallied by the Nominating


Committee, and the Chairperson, Virginia Mann



Quarles is a 12-year member of the Chesterfield branch and has served as Freedom Fund Banquet chairman. He is also a member of the Chesterfield/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers, immediate past chairman of the Crime Solvers Scholastic Program; served on the Crime Solvers Executive Board and the Speakers Bureau. Under his leadership as chairman of the Scholastic Program, the Chesterfield/Colonial Heights Program was cited as the best Scholastic Program in the state of Virginia. In October 2006, Quarles received the State Award for the Civilian Board Member of the Year from the Virginia Crime Stoppers Association, Inc; and in January 2007, he received the Crime Solvers Award for Distinguished Service to the Crime Solvers Scholastic Program from the Chesterfield/Colonial Heights Crime Solvers Board, of which he has been a member since 2000.


