Nominations for 2011-2013

According to the report from the Nominating Committee, they have not been able to get a complete slate of officers for the 2011-13 term. The committee has been trying to secure nominations since March, and gave an up-to-date report at the June meeting. This dilemma was discussed extensively at the meeting and it was finally decided to propose a change to the Constitution and By-Laws, which will allow a longer term of office for nominees; thereby, allowing the current officers to hold office for a three-year term, if they desired. In addition, a motion was made to keep the same slate of officers for the 2011-2014 term, if the membership approves the Constitution change. A vote was taken and it was unanimous. The details of the proposed Constitution and By-Laws changes were presented at the Board of Directors meeting on June 28, 2011. According to President Jefferson, "Peabody Alumni Officers must be persons who will embody and exhibit, through their performance, their desire to continually strive to strengthen and promote growth in the Peabody Alumni Association." Therefore, the Board of Directors submits to you the following proposal:

CONSTITUTION

OFFICERS - Article V, Section 3

The President and Board Members shall be elected by the active membership by secret ballot. Board Members shall serve for a term of three years or until their successors are elected. Their term of office shall begin at the close of the annual meeting following receipt of ballots.

PROPOSED CHANGE

OFFICERS - Article V, Section 3

The President and Executive Committee shall be elected by the active membership by secret ballot. The Executive Committee shall serve for a term of three years or until their successors are elected. Their term of office shall begin at the close of the annual meeting following receipt of ballots.


CLASS OF 1962
