Historical Marker Coming Soon

he Association has been working very hard to get approval for the placement of the Historical Marker for Peabody High School. We have coordinated with Lucious Edwards, who presented the wording for approval.

According to Lucious, and following the guidelines, this is what he presented for approval:



Peabody High School, originally the Colored High School, was established in 1870 in the old First Baptist Church located on Harrison Street. The second school was built here on this site facing Filmore Street. The current site of the school is on Wesley Street. Peabody is one of the earliest publicly funded high schools for African Americans in Virginia. The city of Petersburg had begun to develop a public school system as early as 1868 and provided the funding needed to build city schools and pay teacher salaried. Alfred Pryor became the school's first African American principal in 1882.



According to many senior Alumni, Peabody High School was the FIRST African American High School in Virginia. Your knowledge of this fact is very important to the approval or dis-approval of the wording for the marker, and you are requested to come to our regular meetings with any documentation you have regarding this issue.
